

Wound Care



Clinical wound care team coordinates wound care treatment as well as management of comorbidities affecting wound healing and skin integrity.

Risk factors for wounds in the elderly

- History of previous injuries/skin tears
- Impaired mobility or vision
- Poor nutrition or hydration
- Cognitive or sensory impairment
- Comorbidities including chronic heart disease, renal failure and cerebral vascular accident
- Dependent on others for activities of daily living

Wound Care Services include:

- Standardized wound treatment protocols including availability of progressive wound care products
- Education regarding signs and symptoms of complications along with home wound management
- Clinicians trained with current treatments
- Recommendations for devices to promote wound healing and prevent further complications
- Negative pressure wound therapy
- Coordination with facilities, wound care clinics and physicians
